Year of Service

This Sunday, in addition to having our *Celebration of Gifts and Talents* event (see the last two weeks of bulletin messages if you missed those), we also begin our new Year of Service. This is the fourth themed year from our parish's Vision statement: "Our vision is to be a community committed to welcome, to worship, to grow, and to serve." With a focus on service, our PPC had to ask some really important questions, like, what is service? And in what ways is our particular parish called to serve and grow in service? Who is serving and who is being served? These are all fundamental questions, and in our discussions, we found many answers were just as valid as another.

One definition that came up in our discussions for understanding service was this one which ties together our service toward God and toward neighbour:

"In general, performing one's religious duty as a creature toward God, and fulfilling one's moral responsibility of meeting the needs of others. To serve God is the primary obligation of human beings, personally and socially, to be done in acts of worship and prayer; and in acts of virtue as prescribed by the natural and revealed laws of God. This corresponds to the first three commandments of the Decalogue, and is summarised in the precept to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:37). To serve others is the secondary obligation of a person, deriving from the preceding duty and depending on it. This corresponds to the last seven commandments of God and is synthesised in the precept "You must love your neighbour as yourself" (Matthew 22:39). On these two commandments of service, Christ says, rest the whole law and the Prophets also."- Definition of Service from Fr. John Hardon's *Modern Catholic Dictionary*

Christ's own powerful words in John's gospel also came to our minds: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."- Jn 13:34-35

With these and many other things in mind, it was impossible not to see how much service is already happening in our parish, and this is a very good thing. I think a good start to the Year of Service is to take inventory of the ways that we serve. One of the ways we are doing that was to highlight with our *CGT* video presentation just a small handful of the ministries in our parish that have been serving for many, many years. We would have loved to highlight the service aspects of all of our parish groups and ministries, but we had to keep the video to 45 minutes!

This is a good time to reflect on what service means to us personally as individuals, as a parish, and discern how God is calling us to put our gifts and talents at his service in a greater and deeper way. The spiritual and corporal works of mercy are a good place to begin. Perhaps that means becoming newly involved in a ministry of service, or renewing our own participation and commitment in a service we are already part of. Service is an essential element to our human nature that takes on new depth and height by virtue of our baptism which calls us to serve as Christ came to serve. I would love to hear your own thoughts and reflections on this Year of Service, so feel free to forward those to me.

Having celebrated the feast of our patron, St. Timothy, this past week, it may be good to recall that he was being called to specific service, to continue the work of St. Paul and the Apostles. Our brothers and sisters who have come before us have also entrusted us with the task of continuing the service they began and that we have benefited from. Service is certainly not easy (add a pandemic to the mix?), and this is why Paul asks Timothy to "rekindle the gift" God has given him" (2 Tim 1:6). These gifts of the Spirit, according to St. Paul, are to be placed at the service of the "common good" (1 Cor 12:7).

May God, through the intercession of St. Timothy, abundantly bless our new Year of Service.

HOW TO MAKE RESERVATIONS FOR SUNDAY MASS:

- Reservations for Sunday Mass are strongly recommended. (Weekday Mass is first come, first seated.)
- Reservations go live on **Wednesday at 9 am before the upcoming weekend and close Friday at noon.**
- Please use this link: <https://rsvp.church/r/mRvh7Ock> to make your reservations, or go to our home page st-timothy.ca and click on the blue "RSVP Church" button on the banner  
- If you do not use the internet, you may call the parish office at 204-949-3760 to make your reservation.

If there are any spots remaining at Mass, they will be available to those who arrive without reservations, space permitting. First come, first served. **When we email the bulletin to subscribers on Friday afternoon, we'll let you know if Mass is full or if there are any spots available for "walk ups".** (Another reason to subscribe to the bulletin by email!)

CAPACITY & SEATING:

- For our parish, we have two separate cohorts with **separate entrances and exits.**
 **A)** 25 people in the **nave (church) - enter and exit via the NORTH doors.** (Use the **north-side** parking lot.)
B) 25 people in the **parish hall - enter and exit via the SOUTH doors.** Use the **south-side** parking lot.)
- **When you reserve on-line, please note which part of the building you have reserved your seats - the church or the parish hall - and enter and exit the building accordingly.**

HEALTH MEASURES:

- Cohorts must not mingle, physical distancing between households is required and sanitizing protocols are still in place. Masks are mandatory.
- Anyone who has even the slightest symptoms of sickness should remain home.



LECTIO: MARY: EPISODE 1 THE NEW EVE


