

## What's Happening at the Catholic School of Evangelization?

Among the many hats I wear, one happens to be as spiritual director for the Catholic School of Evangelization. When the Board of Directors approached me, they had lacked a priest as spiritual director for a couple of years, and they were looking for any priest who could come in and help oversee the direction of things and ensure that everything would be ordered toward God and blessed.

I did not have the joy of experiencing the school and camps as a young person, but I did have the opportunity to work there as a seminarian. Just before entering seminary, I had gotten to know some of the good people involved there. Knowing that I had been a chef before seminary, they had asked if I would consider working at the summer camp as the head cook to plan and prepare all the meals for the 200+ children that go through there. Needing a job to earn some money between seminary years, and knowing I could do it well and would serve the well-being of all who would attend there, I took the invitation. A number of years later as a priest now, I was again approached for a different ministry on the Board of Directors, and even with my limited knowledge and experience with the school, I felt that God was calling me to play a part in this important ministry to young people in our diocese.

My goal for this message is really to promote two programs that are being offered by the Catholic School of Evangelization (CSE): the summer camps and their new Discipleship Formation Program (DFP). I think it's especially good to write about these things as they're really quite relevant at this time.

Summer Camps for Kids - The summer camp program for children aged 5-17 is a great option that many in our parish may not know about, especially those who are maybe new to the area and province. The children have the opportunity to attend with others who are of a similar age range for a week of overnight camps which are offered in either French or English. The past two years of the pandemic have caused these overnight camps to shift simply to day camps and take place in parish halls (ours included), but this summer the overnight camps shall return to the beautiful location in St. Malo, 45 minutes south of Winnipeg. I'm sure many children will be craving the social interactions and fun activities that have been missing in many ways due to the pandemic. If you haven't learned about these camps, consider learning about them on their website [catholicway.net/summer-camps](http://catholicway.net/summer-camps) and if you are familiar, consider sending your children to an excellent Catholic summer camp where they can grow in their faith with other young people in fun and memorable ways.

*Serge Buisse was a camp counsellor when Fr. Brian was there. Serge will be ordained a priest this summer!*



Discipleship Formation Program- The DFP is newly coming back this Fall after taking some time off due to review and the pandemic. It is a year for young people to live and learn in community, to develop their personal relationship with Jesus Christ, and to grow in their missionary zeal through practical service and ministry. This program is designed for young Catholics who have completed high school, but haven't yet made any big decisions regarding a vocation or further education or work. It's a great opportunity to give time to the Lord, September to April, and to allow him to form one as a greater disciple, and then to bring that grace into wherever the Lord may call one next. Young Catholics will get the opportunity to live in community at the CSE in St. Malo together, form friendships and bonds, and together will grow by prayer, meals, outreach and ministry, recreational activities, household chores, and receive instruction on many different aspects of living the Catholic life to the full. This program is really the reason why the CSE exists, along with other similar programs in Canada, such as the St. Therese Institute of Faith and Mission in Bruno, Saskatchewan. If this program might appeal to you or someone you know, please consider learning more through the website [catholicway.net/dfp](http://catholicway.net/dfp) and contacting James Kautz, the Executive Director for the CSE. Additionally, there will be a Come and See day and night planned for June 3-4th to better experience what the year would be like.

Please pray for the mission of the Catholic School of Evangelization, and for all the young people who will be encountering the Lord through their various programs.


## PRAY the HOLY SPIRIT NOVENA - May 27 - June 4

You'll find copies of the Novena to the Holy Spirit by the parish office.

The Novena begins on the day after Ascension, starting Friday, May 27 (even for us where Ascension is transferred to the 7th Sunday of Easter). Pray for 9 days, ending on the Vigil of Pentecost, June 4th.

**What is a Novena?** A novena is made up of nine days of prayer and meditation usually to ask God for special prayer requests or petitions. We have our first planning meeting on **Wednesday, May 25 at 1 pm at the church.** We'd love to



### TRUE REFORMERS: EPISODE 3 ST. PHILIP NERI



