Rebuilding Community in the Year of Service

Dear parish family,

I'm certain you have begun to feel the shift to a new season. And while many of us are less fond of this new upcoming season for particular reasons, I would like to think that this new season in our parish community can be a cause for great joy.

Many of our parish committees, groups, and organisations are grateful to not have to spend their entire time and energy discussing how to navigate the constantly changing landscape of the pandemic, and can instead look more to focusing on the purpose for their existence in the first place. Our Parish Pastoral Council, in collaboration with these groups and organisations, view this new season as an opportunity of hope for revitalising our parish life and community, and wish to help promote more ways to live out our communal life and faith. After quite a bit of time apart due to the pandemic, there is a great desire to rebuild community and social relationships again, to strengthen old ones and form new ones. It also happens to be the Year of Service, a response to living out our parish's vision of welcoming, worshipping, growing, and serving.

So we've organised a time that all of our various ministries/organisations/groups within our parish of St. Timothy can make themselves available to meet with other parishioners and talk about what they do and who they are. All of our parish's ministries and organisations uniquely serve in some way, and we would like to encourage our parishioners of all ages and backgrounds to consider in what ways they may be called by God to serve and to belong in more tangible ways, building up communal bonds in our community and at large. We think that this may be a good opportunity for our parishioners, both new and old, to potentially gain some new friends and serve in the ministry or group that can bring the peace and joy that comes from living out our baptismal call, as disciples of Jesus.

On the weekend of October 29th and 30th, representatives of our many liturgical ministries will be available in the narthex before and after our Masses so fellow parishioners can come a bit early or stay a bit after and say 'hi', maybe thank them for their service, and find out more about that particular ministry, especially if you may be interested in serving in that way. The following weekend, November 5th and 6th, more representative parishioners will also be available in the narthex to speak with, but this time from the other many groups and ministries of our parish, such as the Knights of Columbus, Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, and Prayer Shawl ministry, to name only a few.

Our parish of St. Timothy is a fairly large parish, which is a blessing in many ways, but a continuous challenge is always helping parishioners feel connected to one another, and know all that is happening within the parish, outside of just the particular Mass that they come to. We hope these events will be a way to respond to this reality and prove fruitful in fostering the communal life of our parishioners. Mutual service together in its variety of ways is a great way to begin strong friendships or strengthen existing ones.

As I've preached in the past, I often thought of the experience of the pandemic like a sort of 'exile', similar in some ways to the ones that God's initially chosen people had to go through, but there was also a promise of return, and upon returning, there would be a rebuilding of all that had been reduced or fallen apart. One of the prophets that speaks to that return and rebuilding was Ezra: "We are the servants of the God of heaven and earth, and we are rebuilding the house that was built many years ago, which a great king of Israel built and finished." (Ezra 5:11). May we all participate in this rebuilding.

RCIA and Adult Faith Formation at St. Timothy

What is this journey in between the event we call “birth” and the one we call “death”? What do you want from your life during the in between? The questions are there. And, the answers are too.

Who: Those who are not baptised, those who were baptised in another Christian denomination but are interested in the Catholic church, those who were baptised Catholic but have not completed their initiation (not Confirmed), and any Catholic adult who would like to grow in their faith and continue their spiritual journey together with others.

What: Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults/ Adult Faith Formation

Where: Parish of St. Timothy, parish hall (most likely)

When: Most Saturday mornings at 10 am - 11:30 am starting October 29, 2022.

Why: “The desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself. Only in God will he find the truth and happiness he never stops searching for.”-*Catechism of the Catholic Church sec.1, par. 27.*

Sacrament Preparation (RCIA) for Teens

- Do you wish to learn more about and deepen your faith?
- Would you like to grow in your relationship with God along with other teens?
- Would you like to complete your initiation in the faith, begun in baptism, by receiving First Penance, First Eucharist or Confirmation (or all three)?

Thank you, dear parishioners, for your wonderful response to our request for food and volunteers in support of Agape Table! We are overwhelmed by your generosity!

On October 13th, we delivered enough granola bars, juice boxes, pudding cups, fruit cups and cheese strings to feed about 500 people as well as 7 pails of sandwich spread, enough for about 600 sandwiches. Then, on October 14th, five parishioners worked at Agape Table from 8:00 – 11:00 am, making about 900 sandwiches, chopping vegetables for soups and chili, and breaking down the shrink-wrapped boxes of food and sorting them. The staff at Agape Table (agapetable.ca) asked us to pass on their thanks to all of you on behalf of all those who would otherwise would have been hungry that day. The parishioners who worked at Agape Table on Friday reported that they had a wonderful experience and enjoyed working with like-minded volunteers caring for our brothers and sisters in Winnipeg. With your help we hope to repeat this during Lent. God bless you all.

REFUGEE MINISTRY REMINDER






The Jeweller's Shop by Pope John Paul II
