The Eucharist and the Mystery of the Trinity

This week I wanted to continue to draw us into the gift of the Eucharist as we anticipate celebrating the Solemnity of Corpus Christi next Sunday. This Sunday being the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, however, is also a cause for great joy. Providentially, I came across a beautiful homily given by St. Josemaria Escriva sometime between 1951 and 1971 on the profound and essential connection between the Eucharist and the Holy Trinity. Enjoy!

The Blessed Trinity's love for man is made permanent in a sublime way through the Eucharist. Many years ago, we all learned from our catechism that the Eucharist can be considered as a sacrifice and as a sacrament; and that the sacrament is present to us both in communion and as a treasure on the altar, in the tabernacle. The Church dedicates another feast to the eucharistic mystery—the feast of the body of Christ, Corpus Christi, present in all the tabernacles of the world. Today, on Holy Thursday, we can turn our attention to the holy Eucharist as our sacrifice and as our nourishment, in the holy Mass and in communion.

I was talking to you about the love of the Blessed Trinity for man. And where can we see this more clearly than in the Mass? The three divine Persons act together in the holy sacrifice of the altar. This is why I like to repeat the final words of the collect, secret and postcommunion: “Through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord,” we pray to God the Father, “who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.”

In the Mass, our prayer to God the Father is constant. The priest represents the eternal high priest, Jesus Christ, who is, at the same time, the victim offered in this sacrifice. And the action of the Holy Spirit in the Mass is truly present, although in a mysterious manner. “By the power of the Holy Spirit,” writes St John Damascene, “the transformation of the bread into the body of Christ takes place.”

The action of the Holy Spirit is clearly expressed when the priest invokes the divine blessing on the offerings: “Come, Sanctifier, almighty and eternal God, and bless this sacrifice prepared in honour of your holy name” — the holocaust that will give to the holy name of God the glory that is due. The sanctification we pray for is attributed to the Paraclete, who is sent to us by the Father and the Son. And we also recognize the active presence of the Holy Spirit in this sacrifice, as we say, shortly before communion: “Lord Jesus Christ, who, by the will of the Father, with the cooperation of the Holy Spirit, by your death have brought life to the world...”

The three divine Persons are present in the sacrifice of the altar. By the will of the Father, with the cooperation of the Holy Spirit, the Son offers himself in a redemptive sacrifice. We learn how to personalise our relationship with the most Blessed Trinity, one God in three Persons: three divine Persons in the unity of God's substance, in the unity of his love and of his sanctifying action.

Immediately after the Lavabo, the priest prays: “Receive, Holy Trinity, this offering that we make in memory of the passion, resurrection and ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.” And, at the end of the Mass, there is another prayer of homage to the Trinity of God: “*Placeat tibi, Sancta Trinitas, obsequium servitutis meae...* May the tribute of my service be pleasing to you, o Holy Trinity; and grant the sacrifice that I, who am unworthy, have offered to your majesty, may be acceptable to you; and that through your mercy it may bring forgiveness to me and to all those for whom I have offered it.” The Mass is, I insist, an action of God, of the Trinity. It is not a merely human event. The priest who celebrates fulfils the desire of our Lord, lending his body and his voice to the divine action. He acts, not in his own name, but in *persona et in nomine Christi*: in the Person of Christ and in his name.



The Eucharist and the Mystery of the Trinity *(continued)*

Because of the Blessed Trinity's love for man, the presence of Christ in the Eucharist brings all graces to the Church and to mankind. This is the sacrifice announced by the prophet Malachy: "From the rising of the sun to its setting my name is great among the nations, and a fragrant sacrifice and a pure offering is made to me in all places." It is the sacrifice of Christ, offered to the Father with the cooperation of the Holy Spirit—an offering of infinite value, which perpetuates the work of the redemption in us and surpasses the sacrifices of the old law.

The Holy Mass brings us face to face with one of the central mysteries of our faith, because it is the gift of the Blessed Trinity to the Church. It is because of this that we can consider the Mass as the centre and the source of a Christian's spiritual life.

It is the aim of all the sacraments. The life of grace, into which we are brought by baptism, and which is increased and strengthened by confirmation, grows to its fullness in the Mass. "When we participate in the Eucharist," writes St Cyril of Jerusalem, "we are made spiritual by the divinizing action of the Holy Spirit, who not only makes us share in Christ's life, as in baptism, but makes us entirely Christ-like, incorporating us into the fullness of Christ Jesus."

This pouring out of the Holy Spirit unites us to Christ and makes us acknowledge that we are children of God. The Paraclete, who is Love, teaches us to saturate our life with the virtue of charity. Thus *consummati in unum*: "made one with Christ," we can be among men what the Eucharist is for us, in the words of St Augustine: "a sign of unity, a bond of love."

Corpus Christi Evening of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament – Sunday, June 19 at 7 pm



This year, I felt the Lord calling us to celebrate this occasion in a special way. After two years of a pandemic and the inability to celebrate Mass together, now seems to be an ideal time to renew our love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Many of us have become isolated from one another as individuals and families in our one parish community so coming together to celebrate this occasion in a special way can be a catalyst for coming together more as a parish family. Jesus must be at the centre of our lives and hearts in order for true community to flourish in all its aspects. This is reinforced by Canon Law p.528 which states, "The pastor is to see to it that the Most Holy Eucharist is the center of the parish assembly of the faithful."

This year, I invite you to join me on Sunday, June 19th, for a time of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and adoration. We shall begin in the evening at 7 pm for about an hour and a half, so it should hopefully not conflict with too many plans for Father's Day, and could even be an excellent way to also pray for our fathers, both living and deceased, on that occasion. During the time of adoration, we shall have moments of silent prayer, readings from Scripture and reflections from the saints, some singing of hymns, devotional prayers, and Evening Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours. The time shall then conclude with Benediction (a solemn blessing by the Eucharist), singing the Divine Praises, and then Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

As May was devoted in a special way to Mary, so June is specially devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The gift of the Eucharist is the very same gift of his most Sacred Heart. May we draw nearer to the human and divine heart of our Saviour this month by a renewed devotion and love for the Eucharist.





Pastoral Care at the Parish

Maria Castellano is our Safe Environment Officer as well as our staff member who makes visits to parishioners who are unable to come to Mass due to illness. We asked Maria to tell us about her pastoral care ministry:

I bring Communion to the sick, shut-in, or parishioners who are unable to leave their sick family member to come to church. I go to hospitals, nursing homes or their home. We pray, laugh and talk. Sometimes I leave from these visits happy and sometimes I leave a little sad, but regardless, it is always very rewarding.

These parishioners look so forward to our visit once a week. Their smiles and their gratitude fills my heart. I feel very blessed to be able to do this ministry. When they tell me they're praying for me and my family, well, what more can I ask for!

It's very important that we keep those who are shut-in connected to our community, helping them to be filled with the Holy Spirit. I also bring them a parish bulletin every week, chalk for the home blessing, resources for Lent or Advent, blessed palms, any way to keep them connected, so they still feel part of our community even though they can't physically be at Mass.

I hope that one day when I can't come to Mass, there will be someone that could do this for me.




