Pastoral Care at the Parish



Maria Castellano is our Safe Environment Officer as well as our staff member who makes visits to parishioners who are unable to come to Mass due to illness. We asked Maria to tell us about her pastoral care ministry:

I bring Communion to the sick, shut-in, or parishioners who are unable to leave their sick family member to come to church. I go to hospitals, nursing homes or their home. We pray, laugh and talk. Sometimes I leave from these visits happy and sometimes I leave a little sad, but regardless, it is always very rewarding.

These parishioners look so forward to our visit once a week. Their smiles and their gratitude fills my heart.

I feel very blessed to be able to do this ministry. When they tell me they're praying for me and my family, well, what more can I ask for!

It's very important that we keep those who are shut-in connected to our community, helping them to be filled with the Holy Spirit. I also bring them a parish bulletin every week, chalk for the home blessing, resources for Lent or Advent, blessed palms, any way to keep them connected, so they still feel part of our community even though they can't physically be at Mass.

I hope that one day when I can't come to Mass, there will be someone that could do this for me.

Summer and Fall in the Year of Service

With the summer months of July and August quickly approaching, I thought it would be good to have a bulletin message which touches on a number of things on our radar over the next few months.

Summer Music- Firstly, our choirs have done such a great job in helping to provide music for our liturgical worship on Sundays, especially having gone through the challenges with a pandemic that makes singing especially difficult. As they have dedicated themselves faithfully to helping with music for our liturgies every Sunday with little to no breaks, it is also important to have some rest to prevent burnout in any ministry. So for the summer months of July and August, both the 4 p.m. and 9 a.m. choir directors have let me know of their desire to take a break from the need to plan, practice, and organise before returning in the Fall with renewed vigour. Certainly, we don't take a break from our prayerful spiritual participation in the Mass over the summer, but serving in liturgical ministry is certainly an added dimension of service and effort. We are grateful for their dedication and service.

In anticipation of this, I have worked to develop small booklets with the Ordinary parts of the Mass with music on them so that we can continue to sing our liturgical prayer. I have been using these simple English plainchant Mass parts during weekday Mass for the month of June and it has been going quite well. These are the same ones in the Roman Missal that I have access to so I can help lead the singing of these prayers, and the beautiful simplicity of them does not require musical instruments to support the singing.

Altar Servers- The ministry of altar servers is perhaps one of the last ministries to return to our liturgies as we move back (God willing!) to more normalcy. However, with bringing this important ministry back, I also see a great opportunity to renew it and really see this ministry as a big help to aiding in our prayerful worship of the Lord. Altar servers have really been a ministry that has typically been largely filled by young people and children. This is an aspect that I would like to focus on with a renewed program in inviting the young people of our parish to participate by serving alongside the priest in the sanctuary. I think some of the ways that will be of great benefit to our liturgies is by having young people assist in our worship not only practically but also aesthetically with the use of processional torches that can be carried in the processions of Mass and the use of handbells for special moments like the consecration. I will especially be working with the children and teens who will be going through our catechism program and sacramental prep when they start up in the Fall by offering workshops to fill this renewed ministry.

Year of Service Fall Initiatives- We officially began our Year of Service back in January, but some of the ways that our PPC and other ministries have been looking at actively promoting it will really begin this Fall. As Christians in the Parish of St. Timothy, service is part of our identity and vision; we are committed to welcome, worship, grow, and serve. This Fall, the PPC is planning to organise with the other ministries of our parish a type of "ministry fair", where all of the various ministries and groups of our parish will be available after our Sunday Masses for parishioners to be able to speak with representatives, ask questions, and help build community. We're also planning some ways to make these groups more visible with presentations involving youth. The fair will certainly be a good opportunity for recruitment for different ministries as well, and so our parish's Liturgy Committee is also planning to organise and hold training workshops for our liturgical ministries after the fair. This will be for our current ministers to be renewed with ongoing formation, as well as initial formation for newly interested parishioners.

I pray for the safety and wellbeing of all our parishioners these summer months, whether travelling or resting at home.


MOVING FORWARD with Grief

Walking Together: As Pope Francis’ pilgrimage of reconciliation with Indigenous peoples in Canada is approaching quickly, this late-July event will be a further and important step in the journey of healing and peace our Church continues to pursue along with Indigenous peoples throughout Turtle Island. In fact, our archdiocese will be sending a delegation of 55 Indigenous peoples, Residential school survivors from our seven Indigenous communities, who will be selected as representatives by the Chiefs and Band councils of their respective communities. As Archbishop Albert accompanies them to meet with Pope Francis in Edmonton, this will also be an important step in reconciliation for our local Church.



As most of us will be unable to be there physically, it is important for us to commit to joining this pilgrimage spiritually. In this message, then, Archbishop Albert invites us to follow, through the various media (such as Salt + Light Media), the events of this pilgrimage. But not only this. He further invites us to inform ourselves, particularly from Indigenous voices and perspectives, to thus open ourselves up, to read Indigenous literature, to hear Indigenous stories, and to connect, one on one, with Indigenous people in our communities. 
THE BIBLE COLLECTION - PAUL THE APOSTLE

LECTIO: PETER: EPISODE 1: PUT OUT INTO THE DEEP


