
### **Dakota House Ministry**

For many years now, our parish has had a close connection with the Catholic residents at Dakota House Assisted Living Residence nearby. In the past, even before livestreamed Masses, we were recording our parish Masses and bringing that for viewing a communal prayer for the residents unable to come. Along with that, ministers had also brought the Eucharist from the Mass to them for Holy Communion. With the COVID-19 pandemic though, such outreach was either not possible or severely hindered. Since my arrival at the parish in 2020, some of the residents had expressed their desire to continue the connection, and I was able to visit them on one occasion and bring the sacraments to them.

More recently, as things seem to be slowly opening up, the possibility for regular visits to Dakota House is there, and some parishioners here have also expressed a willingness and desire to continue ministry to them by joining the Catholic residents there for a televised/recording of Mass and the distribution of Holy Communion. So far, three individuals have committed to helping with this Sunday morning ministry, and we have been going now regularly for a month or so to visit the 20-25 residents who participate. If you have been involved in this ministry in the past and would like to resume it, please feel free to contact the parish office. If you feel called to the ministry of care by visiting our Catholic brothers and sisters, praying with them, and bringing them the Eucharist, please also contact us at the parish office. We would love to see this ministry rebuilt and strengthened with renewed participation.

### **New Theological Threads**

You may have noticed (or will) that we have a matching new set of liturgical linens for both our altar and ambo. We're including a picture in this bulletin message, but certainly feel free to get a closer look in-person. They're really quite nice. The embroidered images of wheat and grapes obviously refers to the elements which become the Eucharist. The ancient Christogram of the initial Greek letters of 'Christ' called the Chi Rho are represented by the English letters of 'X' and 'P' is at the centre.



These linens were purchased for the liturgical season of Ordinary Time because our previous set of green linens had gotten quite old, was faded in colour, and even had some small stains. We may, at some point in the future, consider upgrading some of the linens for other seasons, but our linens for Ordinary Time had seemed to be in need of the upgrade the most, and we spend much of our year in the season of Ordinary Time. Some of the funds used to purchase these new linens were donated by our own St. Timothy council of Knights of Columbus, so a big thank you to them for ensuring our church can continue to be beautiful and contribute to the worship of the parish.

## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

### August 21, 2022 - 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

"For behold, some are last who will be first and some are first who will be last." Luke 13:30

Our cultural standards are different from God's standards. We often rank people by what they have, how powerful they are, or how successful they are. Jesus reminds us that God will not judge us by the same earthly standards. When God asks you, "What have you done with the gifts I have given you?" How will you respond?

### August 28, 2022 - 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you." Luke 14:13-14

One of the main principles of living a stewardship life-style is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

## REFUGEE MINISTRY REMINDER








