


Image of St. Timothy in stained glass.

New Season, New Opportunities, Part Two

Greetings!

Last week, I spoke about the new season that we enter into and with it, new opportunities. I kind of hinted at some of those opportunities in my last message, but I wanted to elaborate a bit more on a couple of them.

Firstly, I wanted to speak more freely on the progress of our parish's process of furthering our commitment to youth and young adult ministry. At least since I began here two years ago, discussion on this important aspect of our parish was being had at different levels. Eventually, the members of our PPC decided to dedicate themselves in particular ways to some important core aspects of parish life, and so a sub-committee of youth ministry began to meet and discuss the history of this in our parish, what's happening in other parishes, and what options would exist for our own current context. After a period of prayerful discernment, which was especially helped by our parish's own synodal process, where many parishioners too shared the desire to see youth programming in the parish, we then started looking more seriously at investing into this initiative. The members of our parish's finance also met and discussed the possibility for our parish to invest responsibly with the financial commitment of hiring another staff member in some capacity.

The fruits of all of this has led to our parish now having officially hired a part time youth ministry coordinator. Out of the candidates who applied, Jerico Nieves has been selected and will be starting this coming Monday. He comes with great experience in youth and young adult ministry, having spent time with NET Ministries and travelling to Australia for university campus ministry. I won't say too much since I've asked him to provide a write up on himself for next week's bulletin, so stay tuned for that. He really seems like he'll be a great fit for the rest of our parish staff team and a great benefit to the overall spiritual and pastoral life of our parish community. I encourage all to say "hello" to him and get to know him.

The other great and new opportunity is the parish pancake breakfast happening October 2 after the 9 am and 11 am Masses. This will be hosted and put on by our parish's Knights of Columbus, as they have done in the past, but it's certainly been far too long since the last one. We thought a good way to slowly start getting back into great events such as these was to host one this Fall as a good way to welcome people back in an even greater way to the life of the parish community, especially after being so isolated. Past pancake breakfasts put on by the Knights of Columbus usually included a suggested financial donation that would help recoup the costs and go to one of the many charities that they support, but in the spirit of welcoming, they wanted to offer this freely to the parish without any financial ties. We hope that parishioners will feel welcome, safe, and can enjoy the opportunity to share in fellowship with food after the Sunday Masses. You can find out more info on the pancake breakfast in another part of this week's bulletin and future ones.

I hope that the news of these things fill your heart and soul with as much joy and hope and they do for me. Keep your eyes and ears open for more things to come in the future!

To celebrate Thanksgiving, we are hoping to reach out to our friends at **Agape Table** once again (see below) and help them in their efforts to feed the poorest of the poor in Winnipeg. Our goal is to help feed 500 men, women and children with contributions of food, sandwich filling and servers.

- We will be collecting contributions of **granola bars, juice boxes, pudding cups and fruit cups** from now until October 11th. We ask that all food items be deposited in our SSVF food crate at the entrance to the church. You can drop food off on the weekend (before & after Mass) and during office hours.
- We are also asking for contributions of **sandwich filling** in 4 L pails to be prepared in your home and brought to the church on Thursday October 13 between 10:00 am and 11:00 am. Please contact us for recipes.


