New Public Health Orders Effective Tuesday, February 15, 2022

New Public Health Orders have been loosened as of Tuesday, February 15, 2022. Capacity has been increased to 50 percent, but in order to maintain physical distancing as much as possible, we will keep our capacity to about 100 people in the church (nave). If needed, we will use the parish hall for extra seating.

Contact tracing is no longer required by the Province. We ask that you continue to enter the church through the north doors, stop at the NEW table near the entrance in the narthex to sanitize your hands, and then continue into the church.

Physical distancing, sanitizing and mask protocols are still in place.

Reflections on Mass - Part Two

This week, I wanted to continue my *Reflections on Mass* series with some of the prayers that priests can pray in preparation for Mass. I have two shorter prayers for you this week: one to Mary and one to pray for the intentions of that Mass. I especially like the prayer to Mary because of its simple brevity, but also because it invokes her as the mother who is always present to us.

I quite often pray one of the three other prayers before Mass provided, but always include the prayer for the formula of intent. I especially like the formula of intent because it helps me focus, in very concrete ways, on what is about to happen, rather than allow myself to enter in quite distracted or half heartedly. It's also a good opportunity to pray for the specific Mass intention that has been tied to that Mass, and I always recall it when I say the words, "for all who have commended themselves to my prayers in general and in particular".

I hope you enjoy these prayers as much as I appreciate the gift of being able to pray them before celebrating Mass.

Annual Financial Report for the Parish of St. Timothy

Your Finance Committee presents, for your review, the 2021 financial report and the 2022 budget.

While our Sunday offerings account for most of our Income, we have several ministries that have generously supported St. Timothy in 2021 including our local council of the Knights, the Women's Auxiliary, and our Gardening Committee. We also received some income from École St. Germain as compensation for use of our facility for their Grade 5 classroom. We were able to take advantage of the Canadian Emergency Wage Subsidy and the Province's COVID-19 bridge funding. Our Archdiocese has also generously assisted its parishes by reducing the diocesan levy and Clergy Pension Fund from 24% to 18% (average).

We have transferred the \$66,341 net income from 2021 to a Contingency Fund. We also list the Building Fund and the Refugee Fund (as of December 31, 2021). After extensive deliberation, the Finance Committee has decided to increase the 2022 budget by 4.1% (see third column on chart).

Regarding our decisions on the new budget for 2022, we have developed our budget with a conservative perspective like last year, recognizing the continuing financial impact of the pandemic. Our new numbers reflect this, with some adjustments based on our actual numbers from last year. We also expect some things to change regarding the pandemic. For example, many of the provincial and federal financial aids will be dropping off as the likelihood of total closures and restrictions on places of business loosen, which will mean less income. On the positive side, we are hopeful that this will also mean greater numbers at our Sunday Masses, and a rise in offerings. We'd like to especially thank those who have decided to support our parish consistently through direct debit offerings and the many who have dropped by the church during the week to physically deliver your offerings when unable to attend Mass. Your thoughtfulness, care, and consideration will aid in ensuring the continued and growing vitality of our parish for current and future generations.

Thank you for your generous offerings that ensure that all of us continue to be enlivened as we gather at St. Timothy to worship, perform important ministries, and enhance our discipleship. With all the challenges you have faced during the pandemic, you continue to be cheerful givers supporting St. Timothy.

May the risen Christ bless and keep us safe.




Dear Parishioners,

Listening to Indigenous Voices Discussion Groups

Listening to Indigenous Voices is a resource that has been published by the Jesuit Forum for Social Faith and Justice that "...explores Indigenous worldviews, examines the history of colonization, and concludes with sessions on righting relationships, decolonization, and indigenization. Each session includes questions to guide sharing circles as well as curriculum ideas for use in secondary and post-secondary educational settings." Using this book as a guide, small groups of 5 to 8 participants led by lay-people would meet over Zoom for approximately 1 hour every two weeks for 11 sessions to discuss the content of this resource. The cost of this program would be the cost of the books (maximum \$26).

MOVING FORWARD with Grief






